



We continue to bear in mind the detrimental effects that lockdown has had on young peoples' formative years. Some of these are immediately obvious but there are other impacts, which may not come to light for a considerable time, and which we may be made aware of in the future.

Inevitably, our efforts are concentrated on the children and young people who reach out to us as we strive to keep up to speed with the many popular social media platforms that they use. It is Childline Gibraltar's mission to end all forms of cruelty to children in Gibraltar and for this we need to be able to reach out to all those children, parents and families that nee us, when they need us.

# **Our Values**

Childline Gibraltar's core values are based on the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child

- Children must be protected from all forms of violence and exploitation.
- Everyone has a responsibility to support the care and protection of children.
- We listen to children and young people, respect their views and respond to them directly.
- Children should be encouraged and enabled to fulfil their potential.
- We challenge inequalities for children and young people.

# A Brief History

The ideologies which underpin the development of Childline Gibraltar are derived from two major national organisations in the United Kingdom – The National Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children (NSPCC) and ChildLine UK.

On 28th June 2006, at an event held at The Mount, Childline Gibraltar was jointly launched by Dame Esther Rantzen (ChildLine UK) and John Cameron (NSPCC).

Like the NSPCC and ChildLine UK, Childline Gibraltar was started by a group of individuals who believed that there was a need for this service in Gibraltar.

Building on the principles and experience gained by the NSPCC and ChildLine UK and maintaining close working links with both these organisations, Childline Gibraltar continues serving our local community.



# MESSAGE FROM CAROLINE CARTER, CHIEF EXECUTIVE



We will look back and remember this year as the one where we had to respond to unprecedented challenges on many fronts.

Children and young people were among those most impacted by the COVID-19 Pandemic which is evident by the highest number of contacts to our helpline that we have ever experienced. Many found that their anxieties increased, family relationships were strained, and their mental health suffered. Our charity responded to the increasing demand to support children's' mental health needs at a time when children had less support than ever before.

The overwhelming need, alongside the additional challenges operationally and financially that we faced during a pandemic, pushed our dedicated team to reach out to more children and young

people than ever before. Over the last 15 years, Childline has strived to improve and develop with the sole mission to end all forms of cruelty to children in Gibraltar. Our shared mission made us more determined than ever before, to pull together and respond creatively and positively.

It was therefore with great appreciation that we accepted the Governor's Award for 'Outstanding Contribution to the Community' on 16th July 2021. This Award was a wonderful way to recognise the efforts of a volunteer led charity, whilst highlighting the huge need for a service like Childline.

Here are some of our key achievements this year:

# Service Delivery



 As the largest children's charity in Gibraltar, we have continued to offer support to Children 24/7, 365 days a year through our daily Helpline (voice call, texting, live chat and email) and our Appropriate Adult Services, despite ongoing Covid restrictions.

- Our Helpline Service has received the greatest number of communications this year compared to our 15 year history. With 884 communications last year, we received over 70 calls a month.
- In our drive to ensure we offer a high-quality support to children and young people, we improved our standards of delivery with monthly practice development.
- To support these daily services, we have enhanced our early intervention programmes to improve the wellbeing and increase the resilience of children, young people, and their families by developing our schools' engagement and offering sessions to parents. We delivered sessions in two new school environments and delivered more sessions to parents than ever before. During a year of significant disruption, we persevered in our community engagement programmes to reach out to people in need and managed to directly engage with over 1345 people our highest ever recorded.

# **Partnerships**



- As a charity we have developed our partnership with Childline UK where we have benefited from support in developing best practice, training, and liaison with senior management.
- Alongside this we have continued to foster great working relationships with Government departments like the Royal Gibraltar Police, HM Customs, the Care Agency, and the Department of Education to ensure that our services complement and are well integrated with current services for children.

 In our mission to end cruelty to children we have also sought to develop our relationships with local community organisations like Dyslexia Support Group, Autism Support Group, LGBTQ+ Committee, Clubhouse Gibraltar and the Citizens Advice Bureau.

# **Operations**





- Integral to the smooth operations of our services, we have invested in our IT infrastructure thanks to the ongoing support of ITMS.
- Having now used our database for a whole year, we are able to review and provide statistics for impact measurement and funding purposes.
- With the support of Ian Dawson and the team from Community Services, we have also modernised our office HQ with a new kitchen, a fundraising room and a small meeting room.

# **Fundraising**



- None of these achievements would have been possible without the exceptional generosity of the community in Gibraltar, who have donated to the charity in a year where we have not been able to hold some of our most significant fundraising events.
- The addition of a debit card, a contactless payment machine alongside an online donation portal has proved an invaluable investment.

### Communications



- Communication has been a high priority for us, particularly with the current social restrictions, and so we have succeeded in sending out a monthly Newsletter, frequent posts on social media and regular articles in the local press.
- Piranha Designs have helped us to develop a brand-new website, a modernised logo and attractive marketing materials to ensure that we communicate effectively externally.

- With regards to our online presence, we have the maximum number of followers across all our platforms than ever before, leading to our posts reaching out to thousands of local people each time.
- The addition of a debit card, a contactless payment machine alongside an online donation portal has proved an invaluable investment.


- All these achievements under our belt this year, have only been possible due to the charities' dedicated volunteers and the staff team who have worked tirelessly day in and day out.
- Childline is made up of 96 current team members contributing their skills in governance, support to young people, IT, fundraising, and all the other essential skills that are required to run a large successful charity.
- We welcomed 4 new Childline Supervisors, invested in training new volunteers and providing regular continuing professional development. Our current staff team of 10 part timers, includes 7 people who were volunteers for the charity prior to their paid roles.
- It is only thanks to our committed team members, who work so hard and to the people who generously donate and support Childline all year round, that we have been able to provide lifesaving support to children and young people.

# **HELPLINE STATISTICS**

In the last 12 months between 1st July 2020 - 31st June 2021:


- 884 calls were answered by our Helpline
- 21 referrals were made to Social Services last year regarding children who were experiencing, or
- at risk of, significant harm. We liaise very closely with the Care Agency, Royal Gibraltar Police and other professionals on a monthly basis to manage safeguarding concerns.
- 79% of all our contacts to the Helpline came through via WhatsApp.

# Top Reasons for Contacting Childline's Helpline



Mental Health (including sub categories of Anxiety, Self-Harm, Suicide and Depression) account for 47% of all the contacts made to our Helpline.

### Reasons for Referrals



**Mental Health, Neglect and Physical Abuse** are the top three reasons for referrals made this year to external agencies where there was a child at risk of significant harm.

# Childline Listeners' Training

- 446 hours were volunteered by 28 trained Childline Listeners on the Helpline
- 8 new listeners were trained this year. Due to Covid restrictions this was delivered online for the first time
  and it was very successful.
- We provide ongoing professional development training opportunities, in addition to the initial onboarding training. This year all Childline Listeners were offered:
- Mental Health First Aid Training
- Motivational Interviewing
- Solution Focused Therapy
- Safeguarding Training
- Regular Group Supervision Sessions. Many thanks to Natwest for hosting the group supervision sessions in their boardroom.

Our Helpline training is constantly being updated and we work closely with Childline UK to ensure that our training is always of a high standard.





# APPROPRIATE ADULT SERVICE

hildline offer 24 hour, 7 days a week, 365 days a year cover to the Royal Gibraltar Police and HM Customs for an Appropriate Adult to be available for every child under 18 in Gibraltar. We have been providing this service for almost 15 years.

#### The Criminal Procedure and Evidence Act 2011

places a duty on custody sergeants to have an appropriate adult present to safeguard the interests of children and young persons detained or questioned by police officers.



We are an associate member of the UK National Appropriate Adult Network (NAAN) and liaise with them to ensure that the standard of training and delivery is of the same high standards in Gibraltar.

# **Appropriate Adult Statistics**


In the 12 months between 1st July 2020 - 30th June 2021:

 25 callouts were responded to support vulnerable children and young persons who were detained.

This is a 13% increase from last year.

- 92% of the children and young people we supported were male.
- **36%** of children needing Appropriate Adult Support are 17 years old.
- 60% of callouts are at weekends.
- · Interestingly, we had no callouts on a Tuesday.

# Reasons for Appropriate Adult Callouts



Being an Illegal Child Immigrant makes up 40% of the reasons Appropriate Adults are called out for support.

# **Appropriate Adult Training**

- 11 new Appropriate Adults were trained this year across 2 training courses.
- **55 active Appropriate Adult volunteers** cover our 24/7/365 Rota
- **49 hours** were spent on active duty as an Appropriate Adult supporting young people in custody. This is an increase of 145%
- We provide ongoing professional development training opportunities, in addition to the initial onboarding training. This year all Appropriate
   Adults were offered:
- Appropriate Adult role refresher training
- Mental Health First Aid Training
- Safeguarding Training
- Criminal Exploitation Training

Full comprehensive training is provided to all volunteers in-line with the UK National Appropriate Adult Network. The training covers:

- Who can be an Appropriate Adult?
- When is an Appropriate Adult required?
- · What to do when you receive a call?
- What happens at the Police Station (rights read, processing, interview and so on)?
- · Communicating with the Detained Juvenile.
- Recording/forwarding information regarding the call out.

# COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT PROGRAMME

hildline's preventative educational strategy has developed in direct response to locally identified areas of need, especially those highlighted via our Helpline Services.

The aims of our programmes are:

- To raise awareness about local issues affecting children, young people, and their parents/care givers.
- To provide evidence-based information with the aim of enabling and empowering people to make better informed choices and deal with specific issues before they escalate.
- To work regularly with local schools and youth groups to deliver relevant, current workshops/

#### **Our current programmes are:**

# Childline Well Being Champions

- We trained 10 Champions, who in turn reached out to impact over 750 young people.
- This year we have delivered 3 training programmes in 3 schools

The programme trains young people in the five ways to well-being, using an evidence-based model to improve wellbeing and increase resilience, in order to reduce mental health issues. Once they are trained, they will be appointed as 'Childline Well-being Champions'. They will be supported to lead a project, which reaches out to their whole school, college or community on how to promote and make a lasting impact in reducing mental health issues into adulthood. The programme is adaptable for school, college, and SEN use.



The pilot for this programme was funding by Argus Insurance through their 70th Anniversary fund.





This is a copy of the certificate and the badges that students receive after completing the programme.



This group decided that for their project, they wanted to raise awareness of wellbeing in the Gibraltar College by creating a poster for all students to read as they entered the College. There are 250 students who will have read this poster. The 4 students are pictured here with the Mayor of Gibraltar who came to visit and was very impressed with the program.

This is a photo of the 6 Childline Wellbeing Champions, from Westside Secondary Schools. They met here to plan a joint awareness stall to all students in Year 7 across both schools. At their stall they held a Wellbeing Quiz competition to raise awareness of the 5 ways to wellbeing and gave prizes to every successful entry.





The awareness day which the Childline Wellbeing Champions delivered to raise awareness of Childline, was successful and reached out to 500 students.

# **Emotional Health Workshops**



These are a toolkit of sessions which promote healthy mental health and emotional well-being. They are delivered in small groups to facilitate discussions. We explore mental health and emotional wellbeing issues to develop resilience. The aim is that young people become better equipped to tackle everyday situations, including supporting friends and managing anger.

### **School Courses**

The overarching principle of our school courses is to equip children to deal with life challenges, promote healthy mental health and emotional well-being.

#### Year 3 - 'Express Your Emotions'

This is a fun and interactive workshop. Our aim is to equip children to name and express their feelings and emotions through art. It creates a safe environment for sharing and reflecting on emotions. Art is a great way of expressing these emotions as through creative art, children may be able to represent experiences they cannot verbalise. When we value children's creativity, we help them feel valued as people, raising their self-esteem. Children will also gain an understanding of how much a role emotion plays in art making as they create paintings based on feelings.





#### Stats:

We delivered the workshop in every school of Gibraltar, engaging with 400 year 3 students, in total we delivered 20 sessions.

Our Year 6 programme engaged 46 students and the feedback from children and teachers was very positive.

Year 7

With year 7 students, we help them to learn how to cope when things are tough. A resourceful, practical programme which equips students with life-long resilience skills. This year we have been developing this programme and will be piloting this in the Autumn term of 2021.
