the best global standards. This development reflects our continued dedication to safeguarding, as well as our role in the broader international network of Childline services.

Our long-standing partnerships have played a significant role in our success this year. We've continued to develop our collaboration with **Childline UK, NSPCC UK, Care for the Family UK**, and the **National Appropriate Adult Network UK**, whose support in terms of best practices and training has been invaluable.

2. Appropriate Adult Service



Childline offers a 24-hour service, every day of the year cover to the Royal Gibraltar Police and HM Customs for an Appropriate Adult to be available for every child under 18 in Gibraltar. In essence, the role is to act as a protective and supportive figure for children in custody, ensuring they are treated with dignity, respect, and fairness at all times.

3. Community Services



Childline's preventative and early intervention programmes have been developed in direct response to locally identified areas of need. Our current focus is on improving children's mental health and building resilience.

Resilient Minds is our new programme aimed at equipping children with tools to increase emotional resilience to deal with life challenges.

4. Childline Offer Two Family Support Programmes



Our Positive Parenting courses aim to provide common sense, jargon free information and ideas help parents engage with their children and boost their relationships. Our courses and facilitators are all licensed by Care for the Family UK. Courses we offer:

- Early Years -Parents of 0-5 years old
- Primary Years -Parents of 5-11 years old
- Teenage Years -Parents of 12-18 years old
- Children with Additional Needs
- Dads



Our Domestic Abuse Recovering Together (DART) is an innovative, evidence-based group work programme that helps children who have been affected by domestic abuse to deal with day to day living more successfully. The 11-week programme has been developed by the NSPCC so that children, and a parent, can participate in a range of group work activities that are designed to strengthen their relationship during weekly 2-hour sessions.

1. HELPLINE



hildline offers a comprehensive and complimentary Helpline Service, available to children and young people every day of the year. Whatever their concerns, by using our **Counselling Model,** our team are here to listen and provide the

necessary support and guidance to help alleviate their worries.

Recognising the variety of issues children and young people may face, Childline provide a safe and trusted outlet for them to express their thoughts and emotions. Our dedicated team of trained Listeners are available to receive calls, live chats, WhatsApp messages, or emails every evening between 5 pm and 9 pm, providing confidential and non-judgmental support.

Childline has been delivering this vital Helpline Service since 2006, committed to safeguarding and empowering children and young people to navigate life's challenges and promoting their wellbeing.

Based on feedback from young people, the community, and research conducted by the Gibraltar Youth Service, we launched a new helpline, **Teenline**, specifically designed for young people who feel they have outgrown Childline and are seeking a more mature support service, reflecting their evolving needs and identity. This service was launched on 11th November 2024




HELPLINE STATISTICS

In the last 12 months from 1st July 2023 to 30th June 2024:

The Top Reasons for contacting the Helpline this year were mental health, sexual health, and child abuse.

Top Reasons For Contacting Childline's Helpline



- 483 calls were answered by our Helpline.
- This year 65% of all contacts to the Helpline came through our freephone number 8008.
- 946 hours were volunteered by our trained Childline Listeners on the Helpline.
- 10 children were identified as needing support to keep them safe from harm. To ensure we give all people who contact our Helpline every possible support, we liaise with other professionals.
- 9 new Helpline Listeners were trained during the year.
- We provide **ongoing professional development training** opportunities, in addition to initial onboarding training. This year all Childline Listeners were offered:
 - · Domestic Abuse Training
 - · Safeguarding Training
 - · Counselling skills training
 - · Mental Health First Aid training
 - Sexual Abuse awareness
 - Suicide Prevention Training

Our Helpline Services are delivered in line with Childline UK's practice **model.** Our training is constantly being updated and we work closely with Childline UK to ensure that our training and delivery is always of a high standard.

Childline Gibraltar is a member of Child Helpline International (CHI), a global network of child helplines that provide care and protection to children and young people in need. Membership of CHI also gives Childline Gibraltar access to enhanced resources and training, all aimed at enhancing skills and knowledge in child protection and counselling.

2. APPROPRIATE ADULT SERVICE



hildline Gibraltar provides a 24-hour service, every day of the year, ensuring that an Appropriate Adult is always available for every child under 18 in Gibraltar.

In collaboration with the Royal Gibraltar Police and HM Customs, our service guarantees specialised assistance to young persons who have been detained.

An Appropriate Adult is an impartial third party offering essential support to young detainees, when their parents are unavailable or unwilling to be present. Recognising the distressing nature of such situations, Childline Gibraltar established its Appropriate Adult service in 2008. As per the Criminal Procedure and Evidence Act 2011, an Appropriate Adult is present to safeguard the welfare,

interests, and rights of detained or questioned children and young persons. Appropriate Adults play a crucial role in supporting young people during police interviews, ensuring they understand the process and are treated fairly.

Through this service, Childline Gibraltar is dedicated to promoting the wellbeing and protection of young people in Gibraltar.



We are an associate member of the UK National Appropriate Adult Network (NAAN) and liaise with them to ensure that the standard of training and delivery is of the same high standards in Gibraltar.

Appropriate Adult Statistics:

- 19 callouts were responded to support vulnerable children and young people who were detained. A decrease of over 56% on the previous year.
- 83% of the young people supported were male.
- 67% were 16 years and under. This year has seen an increase in 14-year-olds from 5% to 28%.
- March was our busiest month with just under 28% of the total call outs.
- 25 hours spent on active duty. A reduction of 57 hours on the previous year.
- 50% of callouts occurred on the weekend. This is an increase of 26% from the previous year.
- Drugs (Possession, Importation, Intent Supply) and Assaults (Common, ABH, GBH) were the two top reasons for offences needing an Appropriate Adult being called out.
- 7 new Appropriate Adults were trained this year.
- We provide ongoing professional development training opportunities, in addition to initial onboarding training. This year all Childline Listeners were offered:
 - "Safeguarding Tier 1" training
 - · Counselling Skills Training
 - · "Mental Health First Aid" training
 - · Safeguarding in the 'searching of children' training.
 - "Fitness to Interview" NAAN training for Appropriate Adults

3. COMMUNITY PROGRAMMES

Resilient Minds is our new programme aimed at equipping children with tools to increase emotional

resilience to deal with life challenges. Working in Collaboration with the Department of Education, the programme aims to empower students with skills, mindsets, and knowledge to navigate life's challenges effectively. These covered the following topics:



Vision & Dreams - Year 2

Objective: Inspire children to identify their dreams, interests, and aspirations early on and set a positive direction for the future - "Dream Big".

Emotion Exploration & Self Affirmation - Year 3

Objective: Enhance children's understanding of emotions and highlight the importance of positive affirmations to uplift mood.

Positive Thinking: Thoughts, Beliefs & Actions - Year 4

Objective: Teach children about the relationship between their thoughts, beliefs & actions and guide them in cultivating a positive mindset.

Statistics:

· We successfully delivered 41 workshops to 823 pupils in Years 2, 3 & 4 across 8 schools

4. FAMILY SUPPORT

Childline Offer Two Family Support Programmes

ur Positive Parenting courses aim to provide common sense, jargon free information and ideas to help parents engage with their children and boost their relationships.

At Childline we are determined to support parents, increasing their confidence, providing tools that work for their child and their family needs. Sharing ideas with other parents and carers is a key element of these courses. A helpful, easy to read handbook is included with each course.

Our courses include group discussions, based around real-life scenarios and practical tasks to help them build on their strengths. Each session includes space to plan any changes they want to make in their parenting and from week two, an opportunity to discuss how that's



working. Our courses are run in community venues and are usually made up of six 2-hour sessions. Each session is led by experienced facilitators, who have been trained and licensed by Care for the Family UK.

Positive Parenting courses we offer:

- The Early Years designed to support parents of children aged between birth & 4 years.
- The Primary Years -designed to support parents of children in lower & upper primary schools.
- The Teenage Years –designed to support parents of pre-teenagers or teenagers.
- Children with Additional Needs –designed to support parents who have children with additional needs.
- Dads -designed specifically for Dads. It looks at why and how Dads can play an active role in their child's upbringing.



We are delighted to work with the Parent and Child Society, who kindly offer childcare so mothers can focus on these sessions. Our partnership has enabled us to offer 2 Positive Parenting courses, 'The Early Years' to 12 parents across 12 sessions.



All our facilitators are trained and licensed by Care for the Family to deliver these courses.



ur Domestic Abuse Recovering Together (DART) is an innovative, evidence-based group work programme that helps children who have been affected by domestic abuse to deal with day to day living more successfully.

The 11-week programme has been developed by the NSPCC so that children, and a parent, can participate in a range of group work activities that are designed to strengthen their relationship during weekly 2-hour sessions.

Commissioned by the Ministry of Justice, in collaboration with the Care Agency, the DART programme is an integral part of Gibraltar's National Domestic Abuse Strategy 2023-2028.

During this first year we achieved our license from the NSPCC and trained up a group of specialised facilitators and set up referral pathways from professionals and individuals registering their interest to support the children.



Statistics:

• 25 children were referred into the DART programme in the first year.

The UK Government defines domestic abuse as "Any incident or pattern of incidents of controlling, coercive or threatening behaviour, violence or abuse between those aged 16 or over who are or have been intimate partners or family members regardless of gender or sexuality. This abuse can encompass but is not limited to:

The truth is that anyone can be affected by domestic violence and abuse, no matter their age, race, gender or sexuality. Whilst research shows that it's more common for women to experience abuse than men, domestic violence can and does happen to people of any gender. It can also occur in any type of relationship: straight, gay, bisexual, or any other. It can even continue happening after a relationship has ended – sometimes referred to as post-separation abuse.

DART aims to:

- 1. Rebuild the parent/ child relationship
- 2. Improve confidence in parenting
- 3. Help the parents and children reflect about their experiences of abuse
- 4. Help build their self-esteem
- 5. Help to move forward as a family unit
- 6. Help to deal with feelings like anger, guilt, and responsibility
- 7. Equip them with skills to continue to develop positive relationships at home
